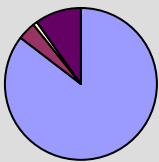

Student Population

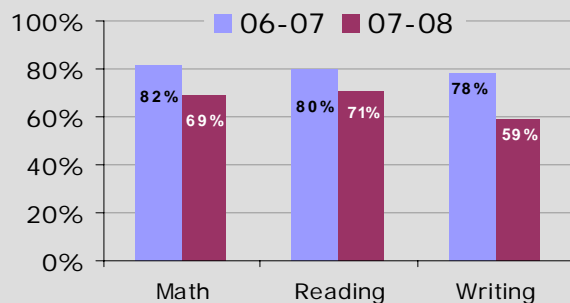

Bold Changes

Despite indicators that student achievement was improving and that more students were meeting state standards, thus prepared for college, Newberg High School realized that the numbers were deceiving. Data revealed that only 45% of NHS students were taking courses or achieving GPAs necessary to matriculate into Oregon's universities after graduation. In 2006, Newberg High School made the decision to convert to small schools. In order to build upon the success of its rigorous curriculum, the campus moved to small schools to create a highly personalized environment characterized by rich and sustaining relationships, and relevant, integrated learning. Today Newberg High School is five non-thematic, small schools. Of the original five small schools, three continue to work with the Oregon Small Schools Initiative.
