2: **The AYP** graduation rate is the traditional calculation. It includes as a graduate, any student in grades 9-12 who received a Regular High School Diploma in 2007-08 regardless of how many years it took to achieve. It is calculated as the total number of graduates in a given year divided by graduates plus the number of dropouts from any grade level. Students receiving

3. **The cohort graduation rate** takes all students who enter high school in a given year (for this year's cohort that's 04-05) and calculates how many graduate with a regular diploma in 4 years. Students with GEDs or modified diplomas are in the calculation as part of the original cohort but are not counted as graduates. In addition, students who take more than 4 years to earn a Regular High School Diploma negatively impact the Cohort Graduation rate.
